INTRODUCTION

Migrants frequently enjoy rights both in their relations to their countries of residence and of origin. How do these rights impact on the conditions under which they can change their citizenship status and on their motivation to do so? Are the rights of non-citizen residents a substitute for citizenship status or pathways to naturalisation? How do the rights of non-resident citizens relate to the ease of acquisition and the limits for retaining citizenship abroad? Papers will study migrants' rights and how statuses are connected both in contexts of immigration and emigration and for individual migrants as well as from the perspective of states.
