Roberta Metsola, Hans-Gert Pöttering, Enrique Barón Crespo, European Foundation leaders address the future of Europe in the 21 March conference <u>The Future of Europe Starts Today.</u>

Prominent members of the European Parliament Former Members Association (FMA), along with the Presidents of the European Political Foundations, academics and politicians will meet at the European University Institute's Villa Salviati to discuss and debate the FMA's contribution to the Conference on the Future of Europe <u>'Our European Union - Time to be Bold, to Act, and to Deliver.'</u>

President of the European Parliament Roberta Metsola stated: "Over the years, we have weathered together many storms: financial, environmental, social, health, political and recently, also geo-political. They have all led to painful lessons. Lessons that we must learn. The Conference on the Future of Europe is a unique opportunity for us to be honest about Europe. Honest about our failings but also honest about our successes. And we have had a few."

President of the European Parliament Former Member's Association Hans-Gert Pöttering states: "The FMA is grateful to the European University Institute, and the EU Historical Archives, for co-organising this high-level event in Florence and for hosting a pluralistic and open debate on our proposal to the Conference on the Future of Europe. We work together towards a European Union that is closer to its citizens and capable of overcoming the challenges of today and tomorrow. I wish to express my hope that our valuable co-operation will continue over the years. Putin's war against the people of Ukraine shows us how important our common European values are and that as Europeans we have to stand together for solidarity."

Vice President of the European Parliament Former Member's Association Monica Baldi declared: "In this moment of world crisis it is important to take into account the extraordinary wave of European solidarity aimed at guaranteeing peace, protecting the rule of law and consolidating participatory democracy through representative democracy as we highlighted in our FMA proposal.
