Event Outline

The aim of the workshop is to mark International Women's Day together with the Biblioteca Femminista, a volunteer-run organisation collecting and lending feminist books in the city centre of Florence, which also functions as a meeting and organising space for different local activist groups. We will have a day of presentations on the topic of writing history from literary sources, specifically women's writings, and on how writings have themselves played an important role in shaping history. This first day will explore both methodological approaches and issues for historians researching literary sources, and specific questions raised by women's literary production. Participants include EUI researchers, a Max Weber fellow, and two external guest speakers. On the second day, in the morning, a workshop will take place where researchers will present literary sources they are working on and questions they have about these. The sources will have been pre-circulated to all participants, and during this session, researchers will have the opportunity to get feedback from their peers and external guests. In the afternoon, we will visit the Biblioteca Femminista together with its founding members and learn about its history and role in the Italian women's movements. This will be followed by a visit to the Oblate Library, which holds the Biblioteca's archives, and a guided tour with the archivist.
